



Bialik remembers for Victoria

BIALIK College represented Victoria in this year's Remembrance Day Ceremony in Canberra on November 11.

The event took place on the Parade Ground of the Australian War Memorial. Bialik was the only school representing Victoria, and the 14 year 6 students were part of a larger group of 102 students from all around Australia. This larger group took part in the ceremony, representing the 102,000 servicemen and women who died in the war.

While it is customary for the students participating to place a wooden cross and a poppy at the Stone of Remembrance, the Bialik students placed a wooden Star of David alongside their poppy instead. This was the first time a religious symbol other than the cross was used in the annual ceremony.

Bialik principal Jeremy Stowe-Linder said he was "immensely proud" of Bialik's inclusion in the ceremony and is "thrilled that [the] students had the opportunity to practise [the school's] values out in the greater community".
