

Bialik College World Record Yom Haatzmaut

Bialik College has broken the world record for the world's largest human menorah. A total of 1048, including students aged between three and 18 as well as teachers and staff, gathered together to form the shape of the emblem of the State of Israel, as part of the school's Yom Ha'Atzmaut celebrations on 9 May. The massive menorah spans 42 meters (137.8 feet) wide and 42 meters (137.8 feet) tall.

To align to the Guinness World Record's strict conditions, two official counters had

clickers recording the impressive number of people involved. The previous record was last set in December 2017 with 577 people involved at a school in New Jersey. Each year Bialik College dedicates the day of Yom Ha'Atzmaut to activities including: all students dressing in blue and white, Israeli dancing, flag raising, chamsot making, a film festival and many other activities to cultivate the students' love for Israel. The Menorah was a highlight in a day full of educational and engaging activities, all in the spirit of Zionism and Jewish pride.
